Notes from your Divan

Potentate's Message



Dear Nobles,

Some years ago, a group of Shriners raised enough money to buy a parcel of land. They dreamed that eventually a building would rise on that spot to house a club and maybe some day a Shrine Temple dedicated to Shriners living in the area. As years went by, the club outgrew the local restaurant meeting places. With hard work and additional money raised by donations in 1975, a small building rose as Sarasota Shrine Club with approximately 800 members under the jurisdiction of Egypt Shriners. The Shrine Clubs of Sarasota, Manatee, Venice, Gulf, and DeSoto soon joined together and formed a Temple Committee to study the feasibility of a project to ask for a Shrine Temple in Sarasota. There was much opposition and, if not for the dedication and cash donations from many Nobles, there would not have been a successful ending and the creation of what became Sahib Shriners of today.

Many Nobles and their Ladies have contributed with hard work, monetary donations, and endowments for the success of Sahib over the past 37 years. As those Nobles looked at the future in 1975, we now must do the same with hard work, monetary donations, and endowments for the future of Sahib. Membership is 773 including 47 Associate Members. In order to keep Sahib, we must ask ourselves, "Are we or should we continue as a Shrine facility that the founders worked so hard to create?" Member's dues are \$125 and distributed as follows: An annual levy for Shriners Hospitals for Children (SHC) of \$5.00 for each member (50% of which must be paid no later than March 31), the remainder no later than June 1 and October 1. A \$30.00 per capita tax to Shriners International must be paid, 50% of the tax must be paid no later than March 1 and the remainder is paid June 1 and October 1. This leaves Sahib with \$90.00 of each member's dues, which is used quickly for payment obligations.

Currently, there are no fundraising events that generate income to meet the obligations of the facility. Social activities around Sahib are not fundraisers. In most cases they lose money. Those activities are fraternal and social events for our members and friends. Fraternal activities and social events are not a plan for fundraising events.

This is a call to you, as a Mason and Shriner, to become active in Sahib Shrine of Sarasota to make sure Sahib continues to exist and flourish. The time is now! Donations in the past helped in the creation of Sahib and has allowed us to exist over these many years. There are no donations being made by individuals, clubs, or units as in the past to help in meeting the obligations of Sahib's facility. Members should understand Sahib Shrine is the reason there are clubs and units. All members, clubs, and units exist because of Sahib Shrine—not the other way. What members, clubs, and units have is Sahib Shrine (our mother temple); clubs and units are secondary for the purpose of existence. New ideas, volunteers, and large fundraisers are needed to generate income (\$10,000 or higher) to allow the existence of Sahib Shriners to continue.


The Hometown Heroes Restaurant/Bar and the rental of the main hall are generating the only income to meet the obligations of Sahib Shriners. There is no other income source which puts our facility in a financially sustainable situation. We must have income. Visit the restaurant/bar once a month, or more if possible. Much of our customer base is non-members and they continue to return several times a month. Please use the facility for parties if you are looking for such rentals, and suggest to your social network what the facility offers, by checking with our Recorder or Accounts Receivable. You may be surprised in what can be offered.

We will soon schedule a special meeting to discuss the future for Sahib. All members should attend. The question from many is, "What does Sahib offer me as a member?" We should be asking "What can I give to Sahib as a member?" Members must rededicate themselves if we are to continue our purpose as Sahib Shriners for the SHC in our area.





The fez is a truncated, cone-shaped felt cap, generally red, with a long black tassel. Formally the national headdress of the Turks and worn by men in Egypt and North Africa. In the western world, the fez has long been a symbol of partying conventioneers and adopted by the Masonic service club, the Shriners. Originally of Greek origin, the fez was worn throughout the Ottoman Empire in the 19th century by royal decree of Sultan Mahmud Khan II (1808-1839).

In modern culture, the fez continues to represent relaxation, if not debauchery. When a cartoon character wears a fez, he is representing indolence, not fraternalism. The Moose International members wore a fez from their founding in 1888 until 1992; and the Benevolent Protective Order of Elks used a purple fez since their founding in 1868. It is the fez-attired Shriners who have entered popular history as the archetype symbol of

the fez.

The fez has been used as the image of partyers as visual shorthand and for comedic effect. In the comics, *The Yellow Kid* (1896) wore a tasseled red fez. Laurel and Hardy in *Sons of the Desert* (1933) wore fezzes. Middle-aged white conventioneers in fezzes were depicted in Mad Magazine in 1998. National Lampoon's *Doom* mentions a "convention of fez-wearing Shriners from the Benevolent Planetary Order of Elkoids."

The fez is a common visual device if film. In *Austin Powers: The Spy Who Shagged Me* (1999), the assassin wears a red fez with tassel. In *Bye Bye Birdie* (1953), Janet Leigh walks into a back room of fezadorned men. Other depictions can be seen in blacksploitation films such as *Willie Dynamite* (1974) and comedies like *Let's Do It Again*.

Television has recognized the symbol of the fez. Depictions of middle-aged or older men wearing fezzes and driving mini-cars, such as in a 1999 episode of Johnny Bravo, do not need to be identified as such to be recognized as parodying Shriners. Judge Harry Stone has a fez hanging on his coat rack in several episodes of *Night Court*, while a Shriner's fez is prominently displayed in Ted Mosby's apartment in *How I Met Your Mother* (2010).

Anti-Masonic claims originating with Jack T. Chick: "We know that Christians were murdered by Muslims for not converting to their false religion. The Fez worn by Freemasons (?) is a symbol of the massacre of Roman Catholics in Fez, Morocco, who refused to abandon their faith." "The original Fez was red because it was dyed in the blood of the murdered Christians"—there is no evidence of truth in this. This man rambles and babbles with little or no regards for facts or truth.

A little history on Fredericksburg Lodge #4, Brother George Washington's home lodge.

Fredericksburg, Virginia has a long and distinguished history. It has a very important place in the formation of the American experiment. Along with that, Fredericksburg Masonic Lodge #4 Free and Accepted Masons contributed more than probably any other Masonic Lodge in America. Its first recorded meeting was on September 1, 1752 with 13 members present. The record book still exists today and is in possession of the lodge.

Over the years, the lodge has had many homes, beginning in 1756 when it met at a tavern on the northeast corner of Amelia and Caroline streets. This tavern at the time was owned by a member, Charles Julian.

Finally, on April 4, 1757, the lodge obtained a Charter from the Grand Lodge of Scotland for the sum of seven pounds. Past Master Daniel Campbell presented the petition in Edinburgh, Scotland. On July 21, 1758, the Grand Lodge of Scotland issued a formal Charter for "The Lodge Fredericksburg." The Scottish Charter acknowledged the members of the Lodge at Fredericksburg was a Regular Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons and was "constituted, erected and appointed with the ... Brethren aforesaid and their Successors ... a Just, true and regular Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons." The Scottish Charter, engraved on the very best quality parchment, is still in existence and in the possession of the Lodge.

More to follow next month.



"Then let us imitate this good man in his virtuous and amiable conduct." Referring to the life and character of Hiram Abiff, the Master Mason Lecture thus instructs us.

Freemasonry offers moral lessons so that we can learn to "...live virtuous and upright lives...." This is, perhaps, the point of our Masonic journey and what separates us from any other fraternal, civic, or service organization.

In the Entered Apprentice degree, we learn to examine the four cardinal and three theological virtues. In the 2nd degree, a plan of education and self-development to inculcate them is offered. The Fellow Craft lecture implicitly assumes that virtue can be both learned and taught, and we seem to take for granted that it can be learned and taught without much thought.

The Socratic dialogue Protagoras examines the question "can virtue be taught?" The dialogue between Socrates (469-369 BCE) and Protagoras (490-429 BCE), which is often humorous, begins with a simple premise that virtue is "moral excellence" and proceeds to consider the parameters and conditions under which it might be both taught and learned.

Such a pursuit is differentiated from those of medicine, mathematics, and science. In each of these disciplines, one need only find a learned professor in the specific field. But where does one find a teacher or college for learning virtue and moral excellence? Socrates notes that there is something here that defies academic studies, scholarly exercises, and professorial lectures.

In the exchanges with Protagoras, Socrates explores some key ideas about virtue that seem to have found their way into Freemasonry.

First, the actions of a virtuous person seem to be guided by some principles or precepts that are both universally applicable and unified. Freemasonry identifies many universal precepts, among them brotherly love, relief, truth and friendship; a belief in Deity. Such principles are unified in that they describe a quality of a person in almost every context, not just occasionally. We don't think of a person being virtuous only in the morning hours with plenty of coffee in the system. Moral excellence should describe a Mason continuously, not just in the morning or inside the Lodge.

practice Second. the of virtue knowledge and presupposes education. Courage, for example, cannot demonstrated by one who is ignorant of risks and dangers. Whether to dispense justice or mercy requires full knowledge of facts and circumstances. Hence, the Winding Stair lecture sends us on a life time journey of observation, learning and contemplation.

Third, Socrates asserts, one's soul must be prepared and of the right disposition to receive and examine both the universal principles and to acquire and absorb knowledge. In this sense, a "student" must have a proper background and propensity to accept instruction. To pursue virtue and moral excellence, one must be both receptive to and prepared for growth, much as an Entered Apprentice makes his decision to leave the west and travel east.


In the end, Socrates concludes that for virtue to be teachable (and learnable), a foundation of universal principles, knowledge, and personal receptivity must be present.

Protagoras, like most philosophical writings, contains some pretty heavy stuff. (Nobody said pursuing virtue and moral excellence would be easy.)

Can virtue be taught? Can we learn to live virtuous and upright lives; achieve some semblance of moral excellence? Freemasonry thinks so – it is what we came here to pursue.

The Scottish Rite's study of the virtues





- Why not collect the whole can? Collecting complete cans would require a great deal more storage space. You should go ahead and recycle the rest of the can in the normal way, in the dumpster behind Sahib.
- 2. How many tabs in a pound? 1,267.
- How many tabs will a gallon milk jug hold? About 5 pounds worth.
- 4. How does it work and where does the money go? The tabs are delivered to the Sahib office (or almost any Sahib club/unit location) and then taken to the recycling center. The money netted from recycling goes directly into the "Wheel Chair Repair Fund" at the Tampa Shriners Hospital for Children.


