as you are willing to provide the muscle, fun, and enthusiasm. It can be done.



SUMMARY OF SHRINERS INTERNATIONAL DUES INFORMATION

The 2020 dues notices were sent, beginning August 2019 through early 2020. Shriners International will produce and provide various membership retention and billing services for every temple within the U.S. and Canada. Therefore, by having a centralized and consistent dues communication process specifically planned to permit local temple follow-up in advance of due date of December 31, doing this will provide our fraternal system with out-of-pocket and administrative savings.

Shriners International's goal is to reduce and identify further improvements of membership retention while reducing costs for temples. Since both U.S. and Canada have seen increases in postal rates, we need to improve and move towards electric communications and payments to accomplish our goal. Therefore, the Shriners International has requested that all temples obtain updated email addresses for as many nobles as possible. According to the Imperial, by expanding the collection through email, rather than the delivery of paper, this will have an immediate impact on costs.

The goal of Shriners International is to get unpaid members as low as possible by the beginning of November so that a temple has a much smaller group to visit or call before December 31. Please note: every noble who pays electronically in August permits the temple to avoid the costs associated with subsequent mailings and efforts associated with unpaid nobles.

If you have changed your service provider or changed your email recently, please check with the temple's office to make sure your email is up-to-date.

The Hospital Transportation Unit has experienced a dramatic change in the number of patient trips for 2019. The patient trips were down by over 75% to the Tampa SHC – Florida; and out-of-town trips were up by 40%.

The 2019 operating budget had been calculated on at least maintaining the number of local trips and a minor increase in the outof-town trips. The 2019 hospital situation was very much unsettled and from all outward appearances is still rather open ended. Our fixed costs, such as insurance and rent, would reduce per unit if the number of trips increased. However, by decreasing the number of trips, the costs increased by mile and by trip. There has been no explanation as to why the SHC - Florida patient trips have decreased. For the past eight to ten years, the patient trips have fairly well stabilized to 200-250 trips per year. The drop in patient trips started in 2017 and has been declining

The Hospital Transportation Unit is 100% funded by donation. We are a 501 (C) (3) directly under the hospital. Donations at the end of the calendar year normally replenish our cash reserves and we continue to operate. The past two years have been at a significantly lower level of contribution than ever before. The HT fund normally carries a high five figure balance. However, it is now at a lower mid-five figure level and with the 2020 budget could be quickly depleted. Imperial by-laws state the temples must provide the transportation service for needy patients at some particular level.

In 2015 and early 2018, HT management decided to buy new vans based on mileage and anticipated maintenance costs. Both vehicles are "truck quality" and anticipate service in the 250,000 to 300,000 mile range. If we had a crystal ball, we might have bought high end "soccer mom" vans for less money and had some more cash to work with. The Arcadia van has served us quite well as it is equipped with the Chrysler straight six as opposed to a Mitsubishi slant four. Anything mechanical with moving parts will wear out and requires some sort of maintenance.

There are some options that will have to

be seriously reviewed and taken under advisement. The Sahib HT issues are not necessarily unique but are similar to other temples. Some temples have trips and a very limited number of drivers, some have drivers but no trips, some have distances issues, others have high risk issues, and yet others have money issues. No one solution works for everybody. Some of the temples have gone away from the driving and simply give the family cash for expenses. Others hire a driving service. The administrative work is still necessary.

Where did the Shrine Nobles lose direction? The latest "all about me"—Sahib Temple membership dues are \$.27 per day—how can we keep the doors open at that rate? The latest "free lunch" attitude drives up in his \$50,000 SUV, from his \$300,000 house, just back from his \$5,000 cruise, complaining that the Shrine should give him a \$7.00 full-service lunch. Better yet, give him a free hot dog and a beer???

Come on guys, get with the program – you did not become a Mason/Shriner to get something for nothing.



One thing we are looking at is having Sahib's Legion of Honor active again for our veterans. We need our veterans working in Sahib. Have YOU gotten your "Just One?"



Masonic Digest / Scottish Rite

The twenty-nine degrees of the Scottish Rite originated from old French Masonic rituals birthed in the 17th and 18th centuries (and have nothing to do with Scotland). Rewritten by Illustrious Albert Pike in the 1850's, the degrees have been updated and revised (and shortened) over the years into their modern form. The old French rituals can be studied in the book "Masonic Formulas & Rituals." Pike's original degrees are contained in "the Magnum Opus or the Great Work."



The Rite begins with a fourth degree. The three degrees of the "Blue Lodge" are the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge system, so the Rite does not confer them. It does, however, possess its own introductory degrees that are referred to as the "Red Lodge" degrees. The monitorial portions of the Red degrees are contained in the book "The Porch and the Middle Chamber" and include Pike's commentary.

The Scottish Rite is classed into four bodies, each with its own particular emphasis.

The Lodge of Perfection includes the 4th through the 14th degrees. They tell an expansive version of the Hiramic Legend. The theme of these eleven degrees might be described as encouragement to "know

thyself." The degrees portray events occurring subsequent to the third degree and explore the role and symbolism of the Ruffians to good effect. Ultimately, the Lodge of Perfection focuses on continuous character development. Our attention is directed inward.

The Chapter of Rose Croix includes the 15th through 18th degrees. Its work redirects our attention outward toward society. These four degrees are at once religious, moral, and philosophical.


The Council of Kadosh includes the 19th through 30th degrees and includes more religious, knightly, and chivalric degrees – each is intensely mystical, instructive, and symbolic. The 29th degree, Scottish Knight of St. Andrew, depicts one of the founding legends of Freemasonry (and contains the only reference to Scotland in the entire Rite.)

The 31st and 32nd degree comprise the fourth body, the Consistory. The former degree returns our attention to the self-examination and self-reflection inculcated in the Blue Lodge and the Lodge of Perfection. It is a powerful degree, admonishing us that the path to the "realm of Light" requires more than simply going through the motions of good conduct and displaying the outward appearance of piety. The 32nd degree culminates with the exploration of the Royal Secret and the Holy Doctrine of the Rite.

The Valley of Tampa regularly meets at its Center in Tampa on the 2nd Monday of each month. Dinner is served at 5:45 p.m. and the regular meeting starts at 7:00 p.m. At our February 10th meeting, Brother Kenneth Carolan, 32⁰ KCCH, will present a program entitled "Charity Depicts Masons."



- 2. How many tabs in a pound? 1,267.
- How many tabs will a gallon milk jug hold? About 5 pounds worth
- 4. How does it work and where does the money go? The tabs are delivered to the Sahib office (or almost any Sahib club/unit location) and then taken to the recycling center. The money netted from recycling goes directly into the "Wheel Chair Repair Fund" at the Tampa Shriners Hospital for Children.

Where are the boxes to be?


In any store or business, preferably near a cash register. Within eyesight of customers making it easy for them to put their change in the box.
