this parade and the afterglow which follows.

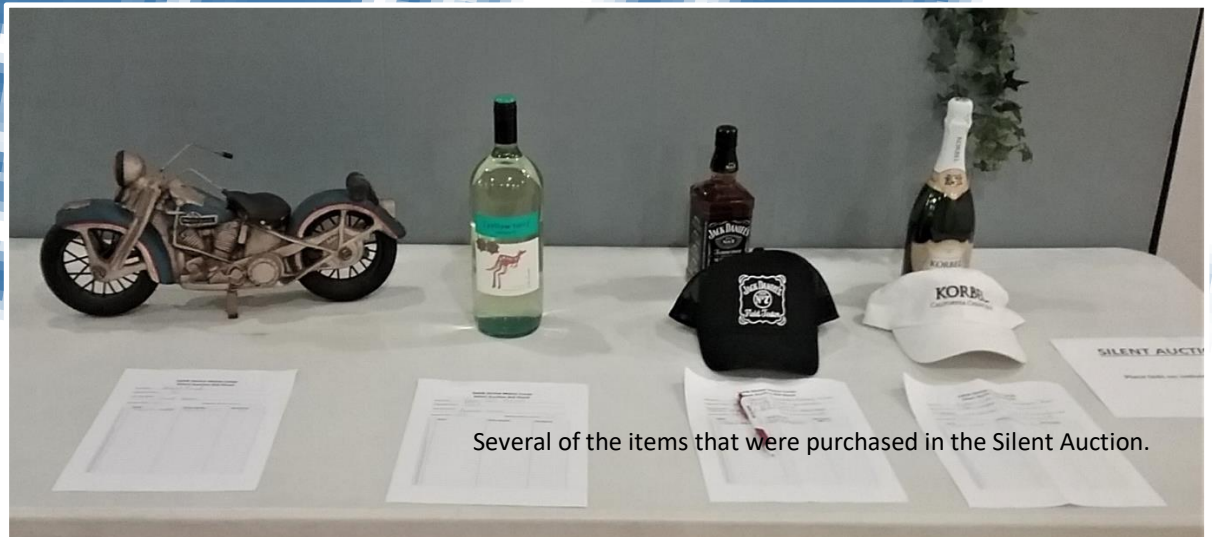

A phone call came into the Hospital Transportation office Monday morning from a patient's mother. She was all worked up because she had not been told any details about another appointment other than her son needs surgery very soon and that it would be at Tampa General Hospital.

To begin with, the patient had had an appointment at SHC - Tampa on August 5. The family lives in Wauchula, needed transportation to Tampa because they have one vehicle used for work, had to pay a third party to drive them using limited funds, and were not informed of Hospital Transportation services. The lady was seriously concerned because the hospital gave her chin music and nothing specific. Hospital Transportation at least calmed one issue by letting know that the transportation issue is solved.

The chin music did not include any

schedule or working information, just a "we'll be in touch." That officially is a "loose end." The fact of the matter is the patient has to know less about the journey than does Hospital Transportation. All they have to worry about is date and time and the sawbones covers the purpose details. She had hoped we would reimburse her for what they had to pay out. We couldn't do that without documentation and pre-approval.

Hospital Transportation will need to know where and when both in and out. Technically, we don't even know where Tampa General Hospital is located. We are capable of finding the building, but we have no idea of what entrance, where to park, how long we have wait to see if the patient is admitted, will the parent/escort need separate lodging, who and what is our contact for a return pick-up, how is the formal release handled, where and when is the doctor's surgical follow-up. These are also officially "loose ends."

The original plan for our end of the hospital-to-clinic transition included having some reasonable information to work with. We assumed we would have instructions and a protocol as to where and how at least sometime before the first patient trip. We wanted to get all the drivers on the same page so we would load up two or three vans, drive to Tampa, look around, kick the tires, slam a few doors, dream up some questions and all go through the motions at one time. As usual, the best laid plans of mice and men runs amuck. Unless some major edict is offered, we'll be back to winging it. Most certainly our Hospital Transportation drivers are resilient enough and capable enough to make a first-time trip work out. No question even a hint of information would make a difference to us.

Numerous contacts have been made with the Scheduling Department asking for information. They have been keeping a very low profile and holding to "I know nothing."

“Freemasonry is a system of morality, veiled in allegory and illustrated by symbols.” Hearing this phrase during the Entered Apprentice lecture several times, it begins to roll easily from the lips. When we hear it, we offer a nod of understanding, without, perhaps, an awareness of what it might mean, what our system is, how our “system” differs from what it is not or what the objective of our system is.

We probably hope the youngest Apprentice never requests an explanation.

Defining or explaining our system is not easy. Freemasonry is *not* a system of inquiry into the realms of science, history, theology, literature, or mathematics; although we call upon and consider these disciplines. Each of these disciplines searches for some kind of Truth or Knowledge, strives to solve some practical problem, seeks to pin-point factual reality or explores some human sensibility.

The scientist observes and tests, seeking factual truth. His search is methodical. Each new discovery of scientific truth displaces the last. Newtonian physics displaced Euclidian geometry. Einstein’s Theory of Relativity replaced Newton. Quantum mechanics, string theory, and Stephen Hawking are supplanting Einstein. The point is, scientific knowledge displaces its predecessor.

The poet or writer of literature dreams and imagines. Each weaves a story or tale that appeals to our emotions, but often just leaves us in a state of sentimentality, ambiguity, or fuzziness. Homer, Dante, and Shakespeare excite the passions but provide little in the way of a syllabus for action. The prophet reflects on revelation and exhorts prescriptive behavior—but sometimes dwells in dogma.

Freemasonry’s system, however, resides more in the realm of philosophy – we are not looking for facts – we’re searching for Truth that leads to Wisdom. The Greek word for philosophy loosely translates as “love of wisdom.”

Philosophy studies and critiques beliefs, values, and convictions; it tests and examines fundamental assumptions about life, conduct, virtue, and morality. It aims to “get things right.” The philosopher works to discover answers to great questions in life, well knowing that many will remain unanswerable.

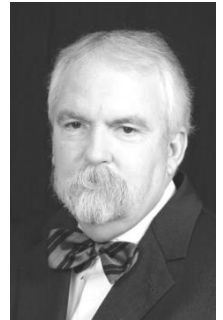
Philosophy historically has three areas of concentration: logic, physics, and ethics. Freemasonry concerns itself with the last arena – ethics. We consider our conduct, character, duty, and behavior.

Both philosophy and Freemasonry are a continuous quest. Our work is cumulative; “new” discoveries of Truth do not replace “old” ones; each insight builds upon the last.

The earliest philosophers appear in the 5th and 4th centuries BCE. We recognize some of the names: Socrates, Plato, Aristotle, and Xenophon. While their pursuit of knowledge and wisdom covered much territory, there is a theme common to all of them. They searched for an ideal form of government, for the best political theory of how society should be organized and how it should operate.

From Plato and Socrates, we get the books the *Republic* and the *Laws*, contemplating a political theory of the best form for a government for a city-state. Aristotle, Plato’s student, wrote the book *Politics*; he refuted much of his teacher’s ideas and offered alternatives. Xenophon, also a student of Plato, examined King Cyrus’ Persian empire and offered entirely different political theories. These philosophers, and others, had differing ideas, but their topic was similar - Theory. Philosophy for several centuries concentrated on finding good theories; on addressing societal or political matters.

Advancing a couple of centuries, philosophy’s aim changed, because the world

changed. Alexander the Great, Aristotle’s pupil, had conquered much of the world. Rome took over and replaced its republic with an empire. The city-state no longer existed as it once did.

Philosophers could have argued until they were blue in the face. They could write, contemplate, and pontificate all they wanted about political theory and the proper form of government – but *nothing* was going to change. The world was ruled by an emperor and a big centralized government. Get over it.

Philosophy did. It made a significant turn in its focus and the origins of Masonic thought are seen. Philosophy turned its focus from theory to therapy. Therapy in this sense – philosophy began to focus on the individual. It began to focus on questions like, What does it mean to be a good human being? What is virtue? How should one live? How can we be free, be happy? What are our duties? What is duty? What does “just” behavior look like?

This is an important transition: theory involves study and thought and the accumulation of knowledge. Therapy requires action and transformation.

In the period from the 1st century BCE to about 3rd century CE, we meet entirely different kinds of philosophers: Cicero (Roman Statesman), Marconius Rufus (Rome’s Socrates), Seneca (advisor to Nero), and Epictetus (a slave). Four schools of thought developed: Platonic, Aristotelian, Stoic, and Epicurean. Each school has its strength and weaknesses, and all can be found in Masonic ritual. In particular they are summarized, though unnamed, in the lecture to the 27th degree, Knight of the Sun.

The work of these schools and teachers did not displace those of the ancients, they built upon it. But the object of the schools was different – the focus was the individual, *not* society. Their object was Therapy not Theory – Action not Debate.

As an example, Cicero developed the ideas of Socrates and Plato about the four cardinal virtues to write a book called *On Moral Duties*. But the book was not about political theory and its audience was not the emperor nor the empire. The book was about individual behavior and the audience was his son. We

find a lot of Cicero's words and ideas in the EA Lecture and in *Morals and Dogma*.

We begin to see the connection between philosophy and Freemasonry. Freemasonry deals very little with theory, it deals with personal action and behavior. The correction and elimination of personal vice, the development of virtue, the practice of good habits, the performance of duty. Much more than about the accumulation of knowledge, our journey is one searching for wisdom – *practical wisdom*.

Ours is a system of philosophical therapy, a pursuit and a lifetime endeavor to “get things right,” morally and otherwise. It is a system that captures and transmits the collective wisdom of the ages. It is not easy, nor it is intended to be. We use the word “labor” for a reason.

Freemasonry so called “system of morality” is the conduct of philosophy – the pursuit by which we learn to avoid vice, live virtuously, perform our duty and to “get things right” in our heads, hearts, and lives. It is personal.

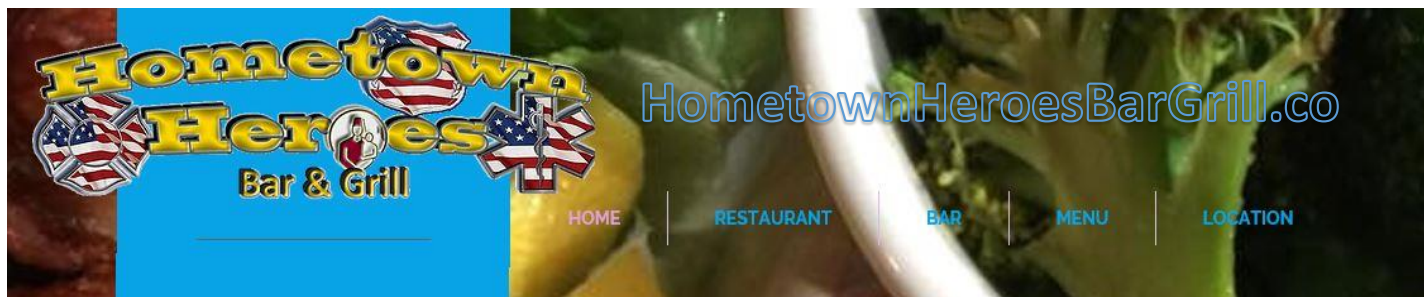
We can conclude Freemasonry's “system of morality” is philosophical, personal therapy. We need it. We *need* Freemasonry. And our society needs us; it needs more virtuous men and more philosophers of the Masonic kind.

And as we make progress in this journey, let us hope that our newest Entered Apprentice doesn't ask us any more tough questions.

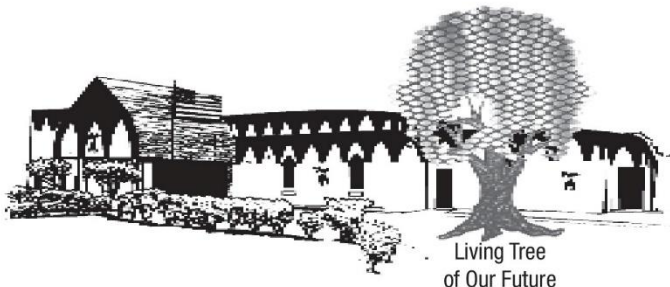

Pull Tabs for Shriners Hospitals

The Ladies of Sar-I Court started in 1992 collecting and donating aluminum pull-tabs to the "Wheel Chair Repair Fund." As of March 31, 2018, they have collected 124,441 lbs., for a total of \$66,809.37 for the Shriners Hospital for Children in Tampa.



Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) on PULL TABS

1. Why not collect the whole can? Collecting complete cans would require a great deal more storage space. You should go ahead and recycle the rest of the can in the normal way, in the dumpster behind Sahib.
2. How many tabs in a pound? 1,267.
3. How many tabs will a gallon milk jug hold? About 5 pounds worth.
4. How does it work and where does the money go? The tabs are delivered to the Sahib office (or almost any Sahib club/unit location) and then taken to the recycling center. The money netted from recycling goes directly into the "Wheel Chair Repair Fund" at the Tampa Shriners Hospital for Children.

Where are the boxes to be?

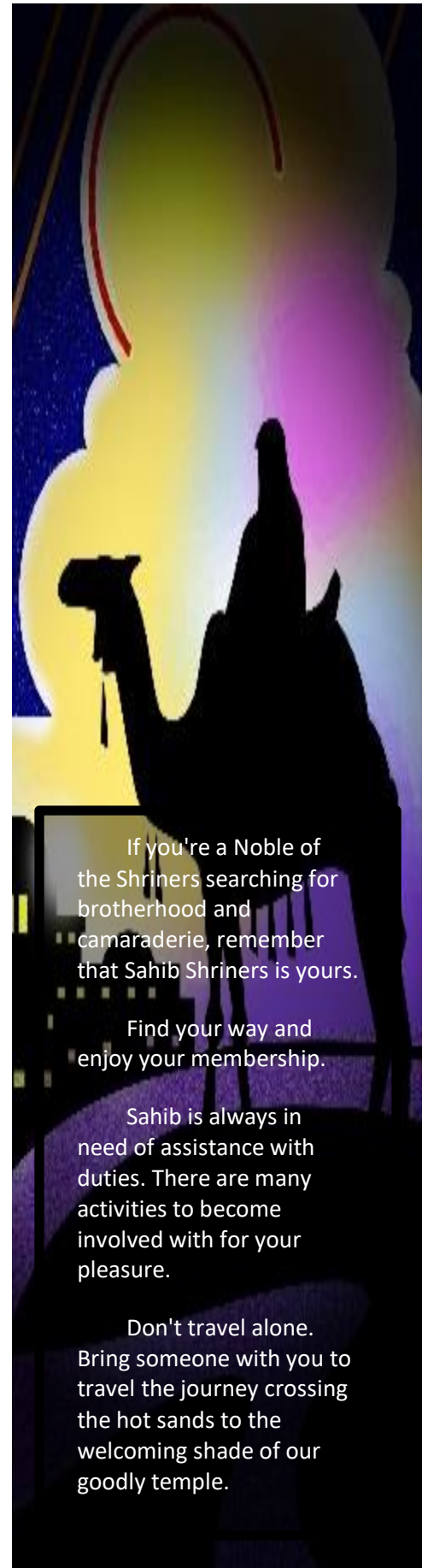
In any store or business, preferably near a cash register. Within eyesight of customers making it easy for them to put their change in the box.

SAHIB SHRINERS WALK OF HONOR BRICK SIDEWALK FUNDRAISER

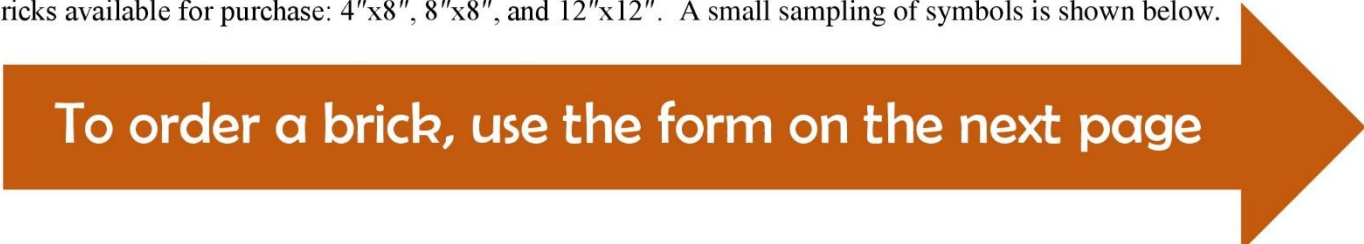
Nobles and Friends of Sahib,
